Both judges gave excellent commentaries, explaining their reasoning for their decisions of all placings in the classes throughout the day. This is always a help to exhibitors, who can listen and learn more about their cattle from someone objective.

In comparison with the Number of Dexter exhibitors and entries there were only 2 other beef exhibitors (Angus with 3 cattle & Gelbvieh with 2 cattle). Dexters are considered a 'minority breed' on the show circuit, so we were well (or over) represented at the Rotorua A&P Show compared to other breeds. This was the case also the previous weekend at the Tauranga A&P Show where only one other beef exhibitor entered Galloways in the All Breeds Section.

Cherry Oak Kyros certainly didn't disgrace himself in the All Breeds Section and proved to be an excellent example of the breed in the challenge for Champion & Reserve Champion. The judge placed Cherry Oak Kyros first initially and then

swapped him over with the Gelbvieh bull at the last minute, saying in her commentary that she decided the Gelbvieh had more muscle down the hind quarters because the legs were longer. Can't argue with that when we show a small beef breed! Betsy Smith
